SUB-REGIONAL WORKSHOP FOR ASIAN COUNTRIES IN SUPPORT FOR THE RATIFICATION AND EARLY IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MINAMATA CONVENTION ON MERCURY 18 TO 20 SEPTEMBER 2014 – NEW DELHI, INDIA



- 1. The sub-regional workshop organized for Asian countries in support for the ratification and early implementation of the Minamata Convention on Mercury was held at the Lalit New Delhi Hotel in New Delhi, India, from 18 to 20 September 2014. Convened by the Interim Secretariat of the Minamata Convention thanks to the generous support from the World Health Organization (WHO), the Government of Norway and other donors, this workshop gathered representatives from twelve Asian countries, as well as IGOs, NGOs and other observer organizations active in the sub-region. It was held back to back with a workshop on "Establishing Legal Limits on Lead in Paint" organized on 22 and 23 September 2014, and the Third meeting of the Global Alliance to Eliminate Lead Paint on 24 September 2014, both organized jointly by UNEP and WHO.
- 2. The workshop was attended by 49 participants, including 28 Government representatives, 13 representatives from intergovernmental organizations, 4 from non-governmental organizations and 4 from other organizations as observers. The following countries were represented in the workshop: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Iran, Maldives, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Republic of Korea, Sri Lanka and Thailand. The full list of participants is available in annex 2.
- 3. The objectives of the workshop were to further enhance participants' knowledge of the Minamata Convention and the processes for its signature, ratification and early implementation. It also aimed at providing participants with information on the available sources of support and at creating opportunities for exchange and action at the sub-regional level. On Saturday 20 September 2014, participating countries presented the draft national roadmap for the ratification and early implementation of the Convention that they prepared during the course of the workshop. Background information:

In its resolution on arrangements in the interim period, the Conference of Plenipotentiaries on the Minamata Convention on Mercury, held from 10 to 11 October 2013 in Kumamoto, Japan called upon States and regional economic integration organizations to take, as soon as possible, the domestic measures necessary to enable them to meet their obligations upon ratification and thereafter to ratify, accept, approve or accede to the Convention with a view to its entry into force as soon as possible. The Conference further requested the Executive Director of UNEP to facilitate activities at regional and country level to support implementation during the interim period in an effective and efficient manner. In response to this request, UNEP is conducting a series of workshops in the interim period until the Convention enters into force to assist countries in their process towards ratification and early implementation of their obligations under the Convention.
