

**Report of the Latin America and the Caribbean regional preparatory meeting for the third meeting  
of the Conference of the Parties to the Minamata Convention on Mercury**

**29 and 30 October 2019, Sao Paulo, Brazil**

**1. Overview**

The Latin America and the Caribbean regional meeting in Sao Paulo, Brazil, was attended by a total of seventy-two participants. Among these, thirty-seven participants represented eighteen governments (Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guyana, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama, Peru, Plurinational State of Bolivia, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Suriname and Uruguay) in the region. The remaining thirty-five participants represented two UN bodies (UNDP and UNEP), one intergovernmental organization, two Basel and Stockholm Convention regional centres, and fifteen non-governmental organizations.

CETESB, which is the Stockholm Convention Regional Centre in Brazil, supported the organization and logistics of the meeting as a partner. The meeting participants acknowledged the support provided by donors from Austria, Japan, the Philippines, Norway, and Sweden.

Ms. María del Mar Solano (Costa Rica) and Ms. Mariscia Charles (Guyana) co-chaired the meeting as they are the bureau members from the region. The meeting was also co-chaired by Mr. Haendel Sebastián Rodríguez (Colombia), in the capacity of the GRULAC Coordinator.

**2. Proceedings**

The meeting was opened by the Co-Chairs. Ms. Debora Vainer Barenboim-Salej, Ambassador of Sao Paulo Office of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Ms. Patrícia Iglesias, President of CETESB, welcomed the meeting participants. Opening remarks were also delivered by Ms. Rossana Silva Repetto, Executive Secretary, Secretariat of the Minamata Convention on Mercury.

A number of governments provided updates on their activities for the implementation of the Convention. The Secretariat provided an update of activities since COP2, and an overview of the general structure and programme for COP3. The Secretariat further introduced the documents for COP3. A number of clarifying questions were raised, to which the secretariat responded and provided further information as necessary and requested.

An interactive and fruitful discussion took place throughout the meeting. The group discussed its regional positions in a closed meeting format. Bolivia summarized the proceedings and outputs of the sub-regional workshop to support countries in the implementation of the Minamata Convention trade provisions, organized by the Secretariat in the framework of the project "Support to the 2019-2020 capacity-building and technical assistance programme of the Secretariat of the Minamata Convention on Mercury in relation to trade and emissions", funded by the European Union.

The Co-Chairs and the Secretariat of the Minamata Convention delivered the closing remarks, and the meeting was closed by the Co-Chairs at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 30 October 2019.
